We have acquired a newer mower, which also has a blade. The motor needs some work, which is in the process of being done. Thank you John Stalker.

# Items for the work party on the 24<sup>th</sup>

- Brush to be cut along road for this we will need brush cutters and if you have a wipper snipper with a blade it would help
- Chapel to be done Chain saws. Strong backs and at least one 4 wheeler required.
- Storage trailer to be repaired Remove rotting siding and ceiling burn if burn ban removed, replace back doors and replace with plywood. Stan to have plywood there cut to size. Could use cordless drills to secure these to trailer.
- Brush and mark red trail

Scoutrees expenses from 2005 are still outstanding and payment is required for seedlings to RVCA. The total on the invoice from RVCA is \$1,560.00 (includes an \$800.00 credit from RVCA for carbon neutral funding). Fundraising donations are still forthcoming from the Lanark County Community Stewardship Council (\$500) and Blair and Son (\$900). I am submitting to Jean LASENBA two (2) cheques tonight for donations from the Municipality of Drummond/North Elmsley (\$700) and Albany International (\$150). The only other expenses incurred for Scoutrees 2005

were for the crests/kits/certificates as ordered through National Office - Jean will look into this and if not paid will ensure that it is paid immediately (this in the amount of \$138.28).

On Wednesday, September 7th, 2005, I visited the plant site with Rudy DYCK, Forester from RVCA. The news to report is bittersweet - while this past year's plant is doing well despite drought conditions, last year's (2004) plant is not doing well and many seedlings are dead. Therefore, the planned plant for this year will be a re-plant/fill-in on this site. RVCA will proceed with the site prep and spot spray on this area and all costs for this work will be covered from the grant money remaining from the carbon neutral funding (\$1000). The cost for the seedling order will \$2,420.00 and I am seeking a motion to proceed with this order...based on fundraising efforts and commitments from existing program sponsors, I am confident that I can raise the money to cover these costs again this year.

#### **School Talks & Open Houses**:

- Over the next two weeks I have school talks confirmed to spread the message of Scouting to approximately 1500 beaver & cub aged youth.
- Plans are currently in the works for school talks for the two weeks after that to another 1000 or so (depending on the size of the schools).
- Anecdotal evidence shows that these talks should result in approximately 10% inquiries about Scouting resulting in about 3% joining. (Of the 2500 youth above this means about 75 youth members to Scouting.)
- Open House (in conjunction with School Talks) can realize as much as 25% recruitment of parents and other adults. It also provides an excellent opportunity to speak to parents the importance of volunteer participation in its many forms.
