1. EVENTS TO DATE:

- a. Beavers started their season on 12 Sep 06 with a Meet the Parent night.
- b. Cubs started their season on 18 Sep 06
- c. Scouts started their season on 12 Sep 06 with a Parent/Youth/Leader CJ07 discussion.
- d. Scouter Tom Joron attended a CJ07 Leaders meeting and reported on it at our Group Committee meeting.

2. FUTURE EVENTS:

- a. Beavers are having an outdoor meeting at the NLAS Fairgrounds on 26 Sep.
- b. Cubs are riding (bicycles) the Trans Canada Trail from Carleton Place towards Ottawa on 24 Sep, and are planning their first camp on 29-30 Sep. at Laflech Caves.
- c. Scouts are heading to Arnprior on 26 Sep. to hike in The Pines and do some Geocaching, and then to Lafleche Arial Park on 30 Sep.
- d. The Venturers are looking for an area that they can use for a month or so to finish the cedar strip canoe that was donated to the Group.
- e. All Sections will be participating in Apple Day on 14 Oct 06.
- f. Scouts and Venturers have been asked to help set up a Haunted House at the Mississippi School just outside Carleton Place for the weekend prior to Halloween.

3. MAIN EFFORTS:

a. This year a lot of our efforts will be getting the Scouts and Venturers ready for CJ07. It looks like 12 Scouts / 4 Leaders, and 5 Venturers / 2 Leaders will be going to CJ07. We have 7 Cubs that the Leaders are looking at moving to Scouts early so they can attend the Jamboree. 2 Scouters are going to WJ07 as IST. Scout Popcorn is being used as a Fundraiser for WJ07.

b. Getting all appropriate paperwork to Scouts Canada for new and returning leaders.

4. ISSUES:

- a. As a Group, we feel the policy of not allowing new Leaders to sign up for a second time if they don't have training doesn't help our Volunteer situation. Not everyone has an extra weekend or so to put towards formal training. That is why we recruit new Leaders prior to experienced ones moving on. Most of the "Formal Training" is taken from the Leader Handbooks, and handouts available through Scouts Canada, which is available to the Volunteers anyway. We feel formal training is a definite advantage, but loosing a Leader who has spent a year helping to run a program, doing fundraising and camping simply because he/she couldn't attend training is not the way to go.
- b. We have concerns about the minimum/maximum number of Youth/Leaders required to make up a unit for CJ07. We currently have 5 Venturers thinking of going, but if one opts out, we no longer have the required number to make up a unit, so everyone looses out. If we combine Company's, i.e.: Area and Almonte, now we have too many Leaders who may want to go.

Estimated cost is \$20.00 for an adult meal, still working on a Childs meal.
