### vi: Scout Trees - Brian Billings - brian billings@carleton.ca

- Performed a site visit of last year's planted areas with Dan COOPER (RVCA) and Jeff WARD (OMNR). Results very promising 80% survival rate overall.
- Starting to look at fundraising efforts for coverage of costs for next year's plant.
- Discovered that Blair and Son have forgot to remit payments for past 3 years and will be sending contributions to the Community Stewardship Council of Lanark County immediately. This nest egg will help cover the cost of future plants.
- Some certificates from Scoutrees 2008 still need to be delivered and this will be completed within the next month. I am doing this in conjunction with request for continued sponsorship for Scoutrees 2009.
- Plant site for Scoutrees 2009 will be across from landfill site on the N/E limit of the Municipal property 3000 trees forecasted for this area (PW and SW).

- Burn around existing landfill site may also be a potential plant area however some prep work required by D/NE (Brian DOBBIE Landfill Site Manager) looking to add some topsoil to the burn as soil is very shallow and not of good quality.
- Had Michelle forward a link to the Blair and Son website where they cite/thank Scouts Canada for the work of planting trees in their Memorial Forest.
