Council Management Advisory Committee met on October 7.

Rod Wilson, Board of Governors:

- Rod brought the Council up to date on what the Board of Governors have achieved in the past year. He was pleased to tell us that the Insurance company representing Scouting was pleased with the Due Diligence and the decline in injuries, which will reflect on our Insurance policy.
- National Scout Foundation, which have helped many with subsidies as well as scholarships.
- Culture diversification in Canadian scouting groups.
- International youth Forum (Korea) with well over 1500 participants

Council Finances:

- Paul Totten is still trying to sort out the process used and workload in doing the books for the Council and areas.
- Statements will be out to groups by the end of November.
- Recommended by Paul that once all aspects are reviewed, that statements come out quarterly.
- Asked each AC for a name of individuals to be on committee with Paul. (Jean?)
- Audited report will be read for the December CMAC Meeting for approval.

Pins for Training:

- Heather proposed that pins be used for recognition instead of the Woggle and neckerchief/beads the second time a Scouter takes a level of training.
- A Scouter taking a WB I will receive the Woggle and pin, and WB II the neckerchief/beads and pin. The second WBI they take, receive a pin only to identify the section they have taken it in. For the WB II, they will receive the pin on a maple leaf. This will recognize their training in the specific section as well as cut down on costs. Each Woggle is \$5. and neckerchief / beads cost \$30. The pins are only \$1.25.
- Participants requesting subsequent woggles/neckers/beads could receive them in lieu of the pins at their request
- Pins would be available to participants having previously completed training at a cost-recovery basis.
- Presently, it would not be part of the uniform. Heather will present the pilot to the National Development Network in November.
- Voyageur will implement effective January 2009, and if it is successful, the Council Commissioner could be requested to present to the National Commissioners' Forum for permission to include as a uniform item.

Group Commissioners Training -

• All new Scouters in any role, whether new to Scouting or currently in a section, must take training if assuming a new role.

- Group Commissioners currently in the role do not have to take the training, but are encouraged to do so. Area Commissioners are responsible for the competency of the Group Commissioners that they appoint. Therefore, they can require GCs to take training if they feel there are skills or knowledge lacking.
- Lengthy discussion ensued.
- As of April 1, 2008, all new volunteers and volunteers in a new role, must take Wood Badge 1 (level) training for that role.

Phil Gazela, our Council Youth Commissioner, is leaving for Switzerland to work at the Kandersteg Scout Camp. Will not be returning to Council, as he will be leaving for school in Montreal on his return. He has done fantastic work in getting the youth recognized and participating more in their programming. He was awarded the Medal of the Maple at ROVENT. (Note to anyone with a youth who has done outstanding work outside their section in Scouting!). Neal Rice, President of the 1st Nepean Venturer Company will be replacing him.
