#### Summary of activities held and planned:

May 22<sup>nd</sup>-24<sup>th</sup> – Troop Camporee held at Camp Whispering Pines 20 scouts participated.

Venturers from Perth were on hand to assist with various activities. Billed as a "Be Prepared Camp" activities also included Trail signs and Following the trails around Whispering Pines – Activity approx. 1 hour. Basic water safety, canoe strokes and proper methods to carry a canoe. Slalom course setup between 4 floating bottles spaced at 17 feet. Relay race across the bay stopping to pick up a baton and proceeding to Beaver pond area to deposit and obtain another baton. Paddle back to the beach where the final segment of the race occurred. Portage the canoe with all gear to top of the hill around a marker by the Kybo and back to the beach. All water events were timed. Points allotted based upon performance and time spent.

Roger and Ken visited around the camp at various times including meal time. Points were earned or lost based upon organization of camp site, neatness of tents, who was performing the various tasks including cooking and clean up. Points lost if adults were involved other than for instruction.

Sherri had to take a back seat due to work and family commitments but is still very active. Of the seven youth, one dropped out for family reasons and another to soccer. One other lad joined the pack as a result of "friendfest"

Both sections have pursued an active and enjoyable program albeit a little difficult at times due to the St Edwards school schedule, but Rideau Vista School helped out and our meetings continued uninterupted. We joined in the Cub winter fun day and the Kub Kar rally. Several meetings were held out-of-doors, including two trips to Foley Mountain and the Cubs held two weekend Camps, both at Whispering Pines Camp, the last being the Area Cub Camp 'Impeeza'.

We commenced the year with a Funding grant from the Area and this was subsequently bolsterd by a grant from the Westport Lions Club and a few other donations.
