COUNCIL MEETING: April 18th

- Announcement was made of incoming Council Commissioner Jim Peverely. He will take over at the end of this Scouting year.
- A National Leadership Summit held in Toronto at the end of March major issue looked at -"Youth and Child Safety" policy and procedure that is in place, as well as 'Duty of Care'. From this Summit, the following has come about.
  - Any returning Scouter who does not have a PRC, WB I, OADA training and Youth Safety will not be re-registered until done.
  - ★ This training can be done by: WB I in person session;
  - E-Learning
  - Possible DVD or power-point presentations.
  - All sessions will require the individual to sign a sheet when completed, unless done by E-learning.
- In future, any training taken (WB I) these two sessions Youth & Child Safety and OADA will be included in Module I.
- There will be a training package for youth (age appropriate) on **Youth Safety** come in September/October that will be presented to all youth. Likewise, there will be one available for parents, which can be done on "Parent night".
- A BP & P will reflect any changes made. Once this is passed by the Board of Governors (May 5<sup>th</sup>), changes will be made effective from that date.
- ▶ **PRCs** ongoing discussion on how to handle this. Some are going through quickly, some not. Those that need finger-printing (birthdate matches with an offender), they do take longer to come back. Be pro-active and start your process prior to your PRC expiring. All Scouters must have the <u>"Vulnerable Sector"</u> clearance.
- A Backcheck: a screening process is once again being looked at to speed things up.
- A Rover's too must be screened and have PRCs.
- A Screening process must be in place for **all** positions including Kim's, Keeo's, SITs This is to ensure that we the right youth in the right place.
- A Spring Registration: emphasis will be on Spring registration rather than Fall, especially so with adults, so the screening process could be completed prior to Fall meetings.
- △ Open Doors: Open to the public for tours of buildings that are normally off-bounds. June 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> the Open Doors is once again running with Scouts Canada Museum being one of the features. If anyone wants to come and help for that day, the times are from 10-4 p.m. Contact Rod Wilson if interested. rwilson@scouts.ca

- △ **CJ Contingent:** about 20-30 attended the meeting with about 150 youth registered to go from Voyageur Council. Pre CJ Camp will be May 2013.

**Spring Advertising Campaign 2012:** The Council will be placing ads in publication throughout the Council again this Spring. We will cover all communities in Voyageur Council through ads in the EMC, MetroLand papers and a few others. Keep your eyes out for them in early May.

New Scouter Welcome Kits, Recruitment Toolkit and more!: Recruitment Toolkits (RTK) will arrive early this year - directly to Group Commissioners homes in April. Along with the RTK will be the New Scouter Welcome Kits for the 2012-13 Scouting year so Groups are prepared to bring new Scouters on board in the Spring. However, Groups don't need to have the actual Recruitment Tool Kit in hand in order to get prepped for Spring Recruitment. Updated promotional resources have been posted in the online recruitment web pages, with everything available for download. Please ensure that all your Groups have received their kits by the end of April – if they have not we will make arrangements to get them to them.

**Spring Registration Recruitment Campaigns:** With the focus 100% on Child and Youth Safety across the country (and the subsequent focus on Adult Screening, ratio's and the tightening up of who is allowed to act as a Scouter and be included as part of the leadership ratio) – it is time now to get Groups thinking about who they will have in place on their leadership teams for Fall 2012. Recruiting at this time of the year allows Groups the time they need to collect PRC's, call references and conduct interviews to be ready to go into the Fall with a solid leadership team base that can built from there. Your CFE's are available to help out in any way needed (i.e., recruitment, screening etc.).

**Spring Registration Reconciliation**: Just a quick reminder to Area's to schedule your Spring Registration package reconciliation with your Groups to ensure that all initial bulk packages are double checked before they go into the office to be processed. Your CFE's are available to help where needed with checking packages, assisting with Screening etc.

**School Flyer Campaign 2012-2013:** In May we will start collecting Group information for the School Door-Hanger campaign. We will provide the spreadsheets populated with last years information for you to confirm with your Groups. In the meantime – it is a good idea to have your Groups start thinking about where and when they will meet next year in anticipation of Spring Registration. The information we collect will be posted on the JOIN website as it was last year, as well as a copy of each Area's information will be provided to all Group Commissioners so that they may refer to it when handling inquiries in the Fall.

Plans are well underway for a very exciting celebration and 20<sup>th</sup> year plant at D/NE Landfill Property on Saturday May 5<sup>th</sup>, 2012. All groups have been sent a copy of the Scoutrees PPT presentation and I am hopeful that we will have a good attendance/representation by all Area Groups at Scoutrees. All participants are asked to arrive at the plant site (corner of Code Road and D/NE Conc. 5B) at 0845h to get planting underway by 0900h. Please remind youth to dress appropriate to the weather, wear good boots/shoes and bring a round-mouthed shovel and 5-gallon pail with handle per planting team. We are planting 3000 PW seedlings and should be wrapped by 1030h/1100h at which point we will move to the area where the D/NE & Scouts Canada partnership sign is erected for presentations and lunch.

D/NE Reeve Aubrey CHURCHILL and his fellow Councilors will be on hand to view the planting activities and provide a BBQ lunch to all participants. Even a special cake is being provided. A special crest has been developed to mark

the occasion and will be presented to all planters and participants. Letters have been sent to all current/former sponsors and former Ministry of Natural Resources staff inviting them to attend the celebrations. To date, I have received a \$100 donation from Centennial Truss in Lanark for Scoutrees 2012.
