COUNCIL REPORT

**School fliers** - are ready for Group Comm. to distribute through the schools.

Changes are now filtering down from National. Our Council Field Executive (Kelly Banks) title will now be "Support Manager".

**Files:** With our Northern council joining us, our Council is now called. Eastern Northern Ontario Support Service Centre (ENOSSC). To that end, we have a huge pile of files that need to be sorted and put in order for future accessibility. Options are being looked at on how to proceed (volunteers vs hiring a firm to do it).

**Camp Opemikon** – A few changes are being made with regards to booking of building and surrounding grounds – i.e. Clements you have the building and field in front. Barker you do not have access unless you make specific request. For that, there will be an additional charge for area to do your program.

**Popcorn:** Doug Coady has a few ideas and ways to expand the popcorn, which will especially benefit the outlying areas. Details to follow.

## Council Youth Commissioner: Ian Wilenius -

- asking for all Areas to have a Area Youth Commissioner.
- impACT2012, October 11-14<sup>th</sup> at Camp Samac first National Youth Conference in many years. It has a full program for any youth in a leadership role. (More details found in the June vision).

**Child & Youth Safety:** Compliance – this needs to be completed by all leaders prior to working with youth. As you are aware, KPMG audit, these are one of the changes being instituted. Bottom line,

the <u>screening process we now have in place is for the protection of our youth.</u> CDs are being made available to all Group Commissioners on Child & Youth Safety that they can show to their leaders at a Leaders meeting. It can also be done by E-Learning.

**Back-check**: A few more details to be ironed out, but all reference checks will in future be done by them, rather than the Group Commissioner. Details to follow.

**Code of Conduct**: When you go on line, myscouts.ca, this form will come up for you to sign. If you do not, you will not be registered.

**Training for interviewing:** Video training session is currently being updated and will be make available for Area and Group Commissioners. This is to help do screening interviews.

**Service visits:** These visits will continue throughout the year. The purpose of these visits is to look at various aspects. i.e. Screening; ratio; program being delivered; training – what do you want; etc.

**Parents:** likewise should be screened; have the Child & Youth Safety, both for education as well as preparing them is they assist with meetings and/or go to camps and sign the Code of Conduct form. This form will be kept with the Group Commissioner.

**Training:** New leaders should have complete screening done prior to working with youth. WB 1 be completed by end of year. Returning leaders need WB 1 before December.

**S.I.T. & Activity leaders:** need screening as well as WB 1 prior to December.

**PRC** – have changed. Check with your Group Commissioner as new ones as well as a cover letter have been distributed to them.

# 2011-2012 Financial statements are <u>due into Area no later than September 26, 2012</u>. If reports are not received each spring then the group will not be rechartered until the reports are turned it.
