How it works:

Print off the challenge form and do as many requirements as you can. Requirements vary depending on your age and the section that you are in, as well as where you live. This challenge may be done with other members of your section, with your leaders or on your own over the summer holidays.

Scouts Canada staff will then send out the number of crests required to the name supplied in the summary or the section contact leader.

Night Sky Observations

 \Box Observe 4 moon phases (1/4 moon, $\frac{1}{2}$ moon, new moon and full moon) over the summer.

Everyone

- □ See a satellite cross the sky.

 Beavers have to see 1, Cubs have to see 2, Scouts have to see 3
- ☐ Identify and name a feature (i.e. crater) on the Moon.

 Beavers identify 1 feature, Cubs 2, Scouts 4
- □ See a meteorite (falling star).

 Beavers see 1, Cubs 3, Scouts 6
- ☐ Identify a constellation.

 Beavers see 1, Cubs 2, Scouts 4



Nature Observations

- □ See birds in July and August.

 Each month Beavers have to see 5 species, Cubs have to see 10, Scouts have to see 15
- □ See reptiles or amphibians in July and August.

 Each month Beavers and Cubs have to see 1 species, Scouts have to see 2
- □ See non-domestic mammals in July and August.

 Each month Beavers have to see 1 species, Cubs 2 species and Scouts 3

- □ Identify butterflies over the whole summer.

 Beavers have to know 1 species; Cubs to know 2 species, Scouts have to see 3 each month
- □ Identify wildflowers over the whole summer.

 Beavers have to know 4 species, Cubs to know 8 species, Scouts to know 12 species.



Outdoor Pursuits

- □ Do an urban (town or city) hike. Hike can be done over several days.

 Beavers have to hike at least 2 kilometers; Cubs 5 kilometers and Scouts 10 kilometers.
- □ Go hiking in the country. You can spread this over several days.

 *Beavers have to hike at least 2 kilometers; Cubs 5 kilometers and Scouts 10 kilometers.
- Go swimming & have a picnic at least once during the summer in and near a natural body of water. Make this a family event if you can.

Everyone

- ☐ Go fishing (with adult supervision). *Everyone*
- □ Camp outside, even if it is in your own backyard.

 Beavers have to camp at least 1 night; Cubs 2 nights and Scouts at least 4 nights.
