## About - The World "Freezie Award" Clubo

Scouter Chris Tyler, District Scout Leader, Eastern Croydon Division, London, U.K. set up The Freezie Award in 1974 to Honour Scout Patrols who spent at least one night camped in a self made shelter in temperatures at or below Zero Degrees Centigrade (32 F)

To qualify, scouts are invited to send in photographs of themselves in such a camp together with details of date and place at which the camp occurred, and how they "Survived" the ordeal.

A Freezie certificate is then awarded and the names entered into a Roll of Honour.

In 2000 the award was extended to Scouts in Canada, where Scouter Chris now resides. The Scorpion Patrol of the First Merrickville Troop in Valley Highlands Area, Ontario, was the founding member of the Canadian Branch.

New Branches have recently been added in Auckland, New Zealand and New South Wales, Australia
